## DANGEROUS SNAKES of ANGOLA




Angola has over 120 different types of snakes. The majority are not venomous or only mildly venomous. Sixteen can Inflict rather painful bites. Fifteen species are considered potentially deadly.

... apply a tourniquet.

**EMERGENCY PROTOCOL** 

- ... cut and suck the wound.
- ... use ice or very hot water.
- ... give the victim alcohol.
- ... apply electric shock.
- ... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
