

COMMON SNAKES OF PIETERMARITZBURG



Pietermaritzburg has around twenty six different types of snakes. Four species are highly venomous, while four others can inflict a rather painful bites. Three species are considered mildly venomous and twelve are harmless to humans.

HIGHLY VENOMOUS

Has caused human fatalities

VENOMOUS

Painful bite, but does not require antivenom

MILDLY VENOMOUS

Not thought to be harmful

HARMLESS

Not dangerous to humans
