DANGEROUS SNAKES OF THE NORTHERN CAPE



The Northern Cape has fifty-six different types of snakes. Twenty-one species are not venomous, while twenty-eight snake species are milldly venomous. Twelve can inflict a painful bite and seven species are considered highly venomous.

IN THE EVENT OF A SNAKE BITE 1 Keep the victim calm, immobilized and transport the victim to the closest hospital without delay.

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

2 If the victim stops breathing, resort to artificial respiration or make use of a Bag Valve Mask.

DO NOT -

... apply a tourniquet. ... cut and suck the wound.

... use ice or very hot water.

... give the victim alcohol.

... apply electric shock.

... inject antivenom randomly. Antivenom (if required) must be administered by a doctor in a hospital environment.
